ABOUT THE WALLACE FARM

The Wallace Farm is a 40-acre parcel of the family's original 160-acre farm and now on the National Register of Historic Places. Henry A. Wallace was born on the farm in 1888, founded Pioneer Hi-Bred seed corn company and was an editor of Wallaces' Farmer. He served as Vice President during WWII in addition to Secretary of Agriculture before the war and Secretary of Commerce afterwards.

Henry and Nancy Cantwell Wallace moved to Des Moines in 1892 when Henry became editor of the Iowa Homestead. They selected one of the oldest homes in the Sherman Hill neighborhood, now the Wallace House. Built in 1883, the Italianate Victorian-style house is now on the National Register of Historic Places.
